Vikram Sachdeva, Director of Manufacturing Excellence and Transformation at Swinburne Factory of the Future, said the partnership will give Australian manufacturers an edge in an era of rapid technological change.

"This international partnership is poised to complement our nation-first digital transformation programme, delivering even greater value to the Australian SME manufacturing sector," Mr Sachdeva said.





Dr. Jesmond Hong, Chief Operating Officer at INCIT, emphasised the importance of this collaboration in preparing local manufacturers for the future.

"Australia's manufacturing sector is entering a critical phase where adopting AI and digital technologies will determine future competitiveness.
